A Message from Pastor Todd

“Being Methodist While Sheltering in Place”

It’s a challenge to follow Jesus in isolation. It isn’t natural to be cut off from others, especially family, church family, neighbors, and friends. It is unnatural for many to not be able to visit, gather, shake hands, give or receive a hug. Many of us are alone. The gift of time on our hands is counterbalanced for many with fear, anxiety, and depression. What can each of us do to remain faithful in our walk with the Lord?

Even as you shelter in place, you can be there for others. Here are some practical ideas I found marinating in our unique Methodist grace and culture:

1. Call. Remember the telephone? Use it to make phone calls. Set a daily goal for speaking on the phone with others. Ask how they are doing. Share a common memory. Remember the last time you both laughed at something funny. Find something to say “thank you”.

2. Write. Remember notes and letters? I’m thrilled to receive a handwritten letter in the mail. Most others are thrilled to get a letter, too. Opening a letter takes priority over bills, solicitations, and advertisements. When writing a note to someone, you can place your entire focus upon them and their well-being. Chose your words carefully, lovingly, and fill them with grace.

3. Visit. But, don’t even think about getting close! Call ahead and set a time. Stay outside the screen door or window and wear a mask. Leave a small token or gift. Can you bring them some needed groceries or medication? Smile with your eyes. Bring sidewalk chalk and leave behind a rainbow or words of hope.

4. Pray. Pray daily for people, circumstances, joys, and concerns. I’m keeping a list of daily prayers on a legal pad. I carry it with me wherever I go. You can do the same. Lay it out there with complete honesty. Tell people you are praying for them. If possible, actually pray with them. Write your prayer out in an email or note and send it to them.

5. Give. Give something. Give anything; time, talents, service, treasures, money. Make your gifts a personal sacrifice. If it doesn’t hurt it you’re not trying hard enough! Give to the church. Give to charity. Jesus is generous in his gift of grace to us; likewise, give generously to others. Target your gift to where it will make the most difference. Donate to organizations or causes that reflect your personal, Christian values.

6. Gather. Not in person. Gather online. I know, it isn’t the same as gathering in person. For the time being, it will have to do. If you don’t feel like taking part in another Zoom video, force yourself to do it for someone else. Other members of our church family and friends need to see you, hear your words of encouragement, know that you care enough to show up, and share with you in prayer.

7. Give thanks. Give thanks to God for the good and the bad. Say “thank you” to God, then list everything for which you are thankful. Give thanks by engaging in daily devotions, possibly using *The Upper Room* as a resource. Give thanks to God by participating in online worship. Worship is a team sport; we do it together! Online worship is the best we can do right now. We are trying to make worship better every Sunday. Touch God and share the awe. Make worship attendance an appointment in your calendar and make it a priority to attend.

You can be there for others. We can be present for each other, giving compassion and care in this time of great need. Be God’s gift of grace to others. It’s a very Methodist thing to do.

Communion on Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost Sunday is Sunday, May 31. Join me online at the 8:30 and 10:45 service times. **I will celebrate live stream worship and Holy Communion at both services.** All participants will have three choices. Choose according to your needs and comfort level.



1) Curbside. For 30 minutes after each service, bring a disposable cup and paper plate, drive to the church, pause at the front door. Do not get out of the car. The consecrated bread and cup will be safely passed through your car window to you, and you will receive a blessing. The Bread and Cup will be prepared with the same (or better) sanitary procedures as is being conducted by restaurants providing curbside or drive in service.

2) Home Delivery. Those unable to drive to the church, please contact Barb in the church office, 533-2170, and we will arrange for a volunteer to safely deliver consecrated bread and cup to your home, where it can be left by your door.

3) Virtual Communion. Bread, Cup, and a gathered community are required. Virtual Communion is not a recognized practice by the United Methodist Church, even though I am aware of its recent practice. The Church has a history of invoking "In extremis" sacramental procedures during emergencies, such as the bubonic plague and combat. In extremis means "in the farthest reaches" or "at the point of death."

In light of our present Covid-19 pandemic, as your ordained pastoral leader, and because of my great love for each and every member and friend of the Rush United Methodist Church, after great prayer and discernment, I am invoking Eucharist in Extremis for Pentecost Sunday. Therefore, you may prepare in your own home a Cup and Bread for your own consumption.

These gifts have been life savers, especially filling the gap before Unemployment Insurance begins or when unanticipated or overwhelming expenses occur.



Mission and Outreach Report

"I've known Christians who seemed to believe that all that God wanted from them was to go to church, to pray, to read their Bibles, and refrain from doing evil. But throughout Scripture we find that God calls us to do good, to practice justice, kindness, and love. When we fail to do these things, our worship and other acts of devotion are worthless to God.

"The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life" by Adam Hamilton is a book our Sunday School class just finished. It is about five essential practices of the Christian life, worship and prayer, study, serving, giving, and sharing.

Perhaps we have more time for study during this time. Maybe you have books on your shelf you can find time to read during this time of social distancing.



All messages are sent to everyone on the list.

If you want to send a personal reply to a message, make sure to check the email address before you send the

message. A simple "reply" command will send your reply to rushumcnews@rochester.rr.com.

Please inform us of changes to your e-mail address. If you think you aren't receiving messages, please send an e-mail to rushumcnews@rochester.rr.com to check.

How do I send a Message to Rush Tidings?

You can send e-mail messages to rushumcnews@rochester.rr.com. The list is managed by the staff of Rush Church. Messages are sent out to all on the list as soon as practical.

Please sign your messages so that it is clear who is sending each message. Sometimes the e-mail address that is automatically listed does not make it clear who the author is.

Simple is better. Messages containing pictures, animations, other complex graphics and attachments will not be sent, since many of these are seen as spam by virus checkers and will end up in junk mail.
