

A Note from Pastor Kyle

As Easter approaches, with all its fanfare and miraculous attached, I think I would like to spend a few moments reflecting on and “**pontificating**” on Jesus’ human nature. Remember... Jesus was both full divine **and full human**. There is not that much written about and looked into as it relates to His human side. For the most part, it is not something people want to think about as they ponder their Lord and King. But, it is something that I have been appreciating so much in the past moments. I guess I should state that I am led by my own ponderings at this time.



On Palm Sunday, Jesus comes riding into town on his donkey. A friend of mine drew this image for me. “Imagine Jesus watching the crowds. Really seeing them. Perhaps not even taking in their shouts at first, “Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!” but noticing faces. A young boy piling up palm branches in excitement. A toddler hiding her face in the folds of her mother’s cloak. Pilgrims pressing in, dusty from the road, caught up in hope and anticipation.”



How did that make him feel. Did he smile? Did he slow down to take it all in. Did it drive him forward. If I were Him (which clearly, I am not) that crowd would have filled me full of energy making almost anything possible. Or perhaps he was already thinking about how these cheers would get him killed. Was he full of anxiety and fear that he hid well? I would love to ask him the question; “how could you do it... did they give you strength to keep going?”

And then there was another processional a week later. The street crowded and full of those shouting jeers and curses to the man who they found disappointing in their eyes. They made him carry his own cross to Golgotha. The cross we will use for our Easter flower cross is roughly the same size as would befit a standard sized human male. If and when you get to see it, it should give you moment to pause. How could a man who has been beaten and abused; who as been marked and marred in so many ways... how could he even lift it off the ground? I would love to ask Him “how could you do it... did their mocking not rob you of your strength to keep going?”

Jesus found himself on the cross - his death eminent and I would have to assume his anguish evident. The Bible states John 19:18 that Jesus was crucified in the middle of two others; "There they crucified him, and with him two others—one on each side and Jesus in the middle". On one side He was mocked and on the other He was recognized.

While on the cross, He was surrounded by Roman soldiers casting lots for his clothes, religious leaders mocking him, and a crowd demanding his death, all while suffering immense pain. Yet in that same crowd were some of His family, and at least one of the disciples.

While hanging there, He spoke grace to the thief, spoke love to Mary and John, and prayed for all of humanity... “Father; forgive them, for they know not what they do?” I have to know... what keeps Him going?

It is too easy to say that Jesus did what He did and suffered what He suffered because He was God Incarnate. I will never know short of asking Him at my resurrection what it was that kept Him going. However, in my own life I see glimpses of the glories and struggles we all experience as humans. I recognize places of heroic celebration and utter rejection. I find moments in my life where I could carry anger and curse others for their actions. And all the while I celebrate that something both internal and external invited me to seek peace, find grace and extend mercy. Not nearly as perfectly as the Biblical narrative records Jesus’ actions; but as I am reminded I, unlike Him, am and never shall be perfect. This is

what gives me the strength to keep going. He is what keeps me going.

Rush Church will be collecting donations in May for the Rush-Henrietta Area Food Terminal (RHAFT). During this time of uncertainty, RHAFT is very busy distributing food to families in the Rush-Henrietta area.

RHAFT gratefully accepts all non-perishable food items, personal hygiene products, and paper goods. However, the following items are especially needed: 100% Juice: bottles, boxes, packs; Jello and Pudding; Boxed Potato Flakes, Minute Rice, Hamburger Helper, Canned Chicken (large), Mayo and Condiments; Coffee: instant and ground (no K-cups); Fresh Vegetables; Canned Meat/Fish Products: Ham, Spam, Tuna, etc; Fruits: cans, jars, packs, etc; Toiletries/Bar Soap/Paper Goods.

You can bring items to the church Monday – Friday from 7AM – 5PM and leave them in the box in the vestibule or on Sundays. We will see they are taken to the center.

Cash donations are also appreciated for perishable food items such as meat and milk. Please make your check payable to Rush United Methodist Church, write in the memo area "RHAFT" and mail it to PO Box 49, Rush, NY 14543 or deliver it to the church. A check will be sent to them at the end of the month.

The need for emergency supplies of food, especially protein, personal hygiene products and paper goods is constant. Thank you for your continuing support of our community's emergency food cupboard.

Join Us for Holy Week Activities






High School Senior College Scholarship

Capital Stewardship Campaign Update

As of Wednesday, March 25, 2026, we have received \$269,200.00 or 53.84% in pledges towards our \$500,000.00 goal. Of the amount pledged, we have received \$227,265.70 of which \$164,446.69 has been spent on fabric to reupholster the sanctuary chairs, for the materials and installation of the carpet and baseboard in the lobby, sitting area and halls, for repairs to gutters, as a deposit and finishing the drainage work in the parking lot and west side of the building and patching, sealing and striping the driveway and parking lot and for the permit, electronic sign and electrical work to install the sign. Twenty-one thousand two hundred seventy dollars (\$21,270.00), not pledged, of this total has been designated for the electronic sign. \$10,000.00 of this was donated by PromiseLand Childcare. Additionally, a deposit has been paid to repair and replace the board and batten siding to prepare it for staining in the spring. Pledges continue to be accepted. Even if you haven't made a pledge, donations to the Capital Stewardship Campaign are gratefully accepted.

I hope to have everyone who wishes to go have their flights in place so I can make reservations for lodging and a vehicle by the end of March I am pleased to have Dr. Etta Eskridge joining us. She is the Medical Director for Rochester Regional Health's Hospice program. "Some of us sidestep suffering, thinking

that avoiding it brings happiness, but God stands with the brokenhearted. When we stand with the suffering, we encounter the God of mercy. Easter compels us to seek others wherever they are suffering, especially where suffering occurs on a vast scale. 
Baptisms of Easley Ann Modafferi and Remington Mark Kuhn Clendenning


