





Board of Trustees



Mission and Outreach

A Christmas week prayer from A Guide to Prayer for All Who Seek God, Norman Shawchuck and Reuben P. Job:

“Make me worthy, Lord, to serve you and all the world’s people who live and die in loneliness, hunger, poverty and sickness. Give them through my hands this day their daily bread, and by my love, give them peace and joy.”



None of us can serve “all the world’s people,” but in supporting the Zululand Hospice Association (ZHA) you are responding to this prayer. Thank to all who shop at the fund-raisers and donate.

I have met patients whose care is provided solely by the ZHA staff. In

some cases, neighbors have offered to get medication or food, then keep the funds for themselves. A Babamkulu asked hospice to take his grandson to the orphanage as he was dying of TB. The government social worker did not approve as the foster care grant was the only income for the household.

We visited Thabile who was dying of AIDS. She had 2 young teen daughters with no plan for their future as her family had abandoned her. The nurse found her sister and spoke to her about the girls. She reunited with Thabile and took the girls.



ZHA provides nutrition for many of the patients. Sometimes patients are discharged after a period of time as they improve with the food, medication and care provided by hospice staff.

Most of ZHA’s patients are indigent, many living in hovels

without plumbing or electricity. South Africa ranks number 1 in income inequality. (The US is 71st)

There is no government support for hospice and international funding has disappeared as HIV/AIDS is no longer in the news. However due to poverty and gender inequality, it remains rampant in the Kwa-Zulu Natal along with TB and cancer.

“Compassion flows from our becoming more aware of the human needs around us. Real awareness far exceeds the capacity of either information or rational analysis to effect lasting inner change.” A Mile in My Shoes, Trevor Hudson



I hope to travel to South Africa the last 2 weeks in April, 2023. We accompany the ZHA staff and visit Musa weNkosi, a home for AIDS orphans. Let me know if you would like to increase your awareness of the human need there. The cost is around \$3500 for airfare, lodging at Raptors Rest, vehicle rental, a 2 night stay at Wendys Country Lodge with a safari to Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Game Reserve and the Isimangaliso Wetland Park. We spend 2 nights in Johannesburg to shop at the Rosebank Craft Market and tour Soweto.

Lungile, a careworker wrote, “You are the bright, shiny star in the middle of the night. You shine so that we can pick our needles and mend the lives of our patients.

Your presence was the blessing to me and my colleagues. You are the blessing to our Zululand Hospice patients. They know we cannot breathe without you.”

Our love provides them with peace and joy and the ability to continue the work of ZHA.

2023 Rush UMC Leaders!

With the start of the new year, we welcome new church leaders elected at our October annual church conference. We are blessed with numerous, effective, talented, experienced, committed church leaders to ensure our vitality and smooth operation.

Leadership Ministries Team: discerns God's will and direction for our church family and the steps necessary to faithfully achieve these goals. Leadership empowers working committees or teams (see below) to conduct the day-to-day operations of the church. Meets quarterly. Serving in the class of 2023 are Erin Bills, Geoff Furman, and Cindy Gray; class of 2024 are Michelle Prok and Steve Williams, and class of 2025 is Dan Kingsley. Steve was also elected to serve as the chairperson of Leadership.

Board of Trustees: an operational team that serves as stewards of the buildings, church property, legal affairs, insurance, and major financial holdings. In our church, the Trustees have delegated stewardship of our financial holdings to excellent care of the Endowment Committee. Serving through 2023 is Patti Weaver, Rob Gruschow and Cindy Gray. Serving through 2024 is Dick Wallace and Geoff Furman. Serving through 2025 is Paul Kingsley, Chris Chamot, and Gary Prok. Cindy Gray will continue as the chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC): an operational team that serves all Human Resources, employment, and pastoral appointment functions for the church. The SPRC provides annual reviews of the pastor and staff, recommends compensation, and benefits, and serves as the primary liaison with the Bishop's Office when there is a change of appointment. Serving through 2023 is Erin Bills (chairperson), through 2024 is Jan Funkhauser, through 2025 is George Gray and through 2026 is Anita Steans and Dan Kingsley.

Finance Committee: an operational team that monitors income and expenses, recommends the annual budget, conducts the annual stewardship drive, and establishes fiscal policies for exceptional stewardship. Michelle Prok has agreed to serve as the chairperson and liaison with the Leadership team, serving through 2025. Tanya hunt will serve through 2023. Serving through 2024 is Ken Graham and Jim Comstock. Ex-officio staff who support Finance are Barb Kingsley (financial secretary) and Spencer Haynes (treasurer).

Endowment Fund Team: an operational team, directed by the Board of Trustees, that establishes, monitors, and maintains all long-term investments and records for the church. They meet as needed to consult with investment partners to minimize risk while maximizing returns. They also receive applications for appropriate grants and loans. The Endowment Fund Team is led by Tanya Hunt, serving through 2026. Jan Funkhauser is serving through 2023, and Casey Beebe is serving through 2024.

Serving through 2025 is Gary Edom and Ken Graham.

Memorial Committee: an operational team that receives and acknowledges all memorial gifts to the church and works with the family to identify and fund appropriate memorials in the name of the deceased. Serving on the Memorial Committee is Barb Kingsley, Tanya Hunt, and Juliet Johnson.

Lay Leaders: Individuals empowered to ensure our core values are met or exceeded, encouraging good communication and cooperation, and can make effective progress. Tanya Hunt is our Lay Leader for Children, Youth, and Family ministries. Steve Williams is our Lay Leader for Worship Excellence. Erma Perkins is our Lay Leader for Mission and Outreach.

Lay Member to Annual Conference: represents the laity of the Rush United Methodist Church at the annual and specially called sessions of the Upper New York Conference of the United Methodist Church. The Lay Member also serves as the information conduit between the Upper New York Conference and the local church. Leon Perkins serves as our Lay Member to Annual Conference.


