I'm optimistic. I'm optimistic about our church and God's future for our church family. Let me tell you why. The pandemic is being vaccinated into

submission. We grieve those who have suffered and died. Yet we are filled with joy with each dawning day. As guidelines from NY State and our Conference ease, so too will Leadership respond accordingly.

Worship excels. So many give time and talents to provide excellence in worship every Sunday. I can't wait to sing out loud again! It takes a village, it is said, ... ushers, greeters, production volunteers, musicians, readers, designers, and others to make worship intimate, meaningful, and Spirit filled, both in person and streamed. Worship attendance and video streams over the past 12 weeks have remained strong, averaged 250 each Sunday. Thank you to our Lay Leader of Worship, Steve Williams, and your entire team.


Inspiring mission plans are being made. Inquiries are being made into service opportunities and experiences to South Africa and Kentucky's Red Bird Mission in 2022. Our elders and shut-ins are being regularly contacted or visited. Lunches continue to be served to homeless individuals at Christ Church downtown. Apartments for refugees continue to be renovated. A new Mission Advisory Board is being planned. If you'd like to become more involved in missions and outreach, contact Erma Perkins, who is doing a great job as our Lay Leader for Missions heading up this effort.

We are investing in children, youth, and families. Within a month of approving of a replacement playground over \$6,500 has been donated to reduce the \$15,000 loan from our Endowment fund. Thank you! Once the Town of Rush grants approval, construction will begin. Confirmation class is up and running with four wonderful youth, mentors, and parents. Updates have been made by parents and youth to the job description for a Youth Director and plans have been made and approved to employ a new Youth Director as early as September. Dorothy Genazzio and Geoffrey Furman are leading up the effort to revitalize the Youth Fellowship Group. Speak with them if you are interested in serving on a Youth

Advisory Board.

Finances are strong. I encourage you to download from our webpage (https://www.rushumc.com/ documents under the heading of "Minutes of Finance Team") our most recent financial statement and Q1 2021 Presentation to Leadership. Both pledging and income is up, while expenses are down. Spencer Haynes, our new church Treasure, does an outstanding job in his presentation and is willing to answer any questions. An anonymous, unrestricted gift of \$25,000 was given to our Endowment fund, and an anonymous gift of \$5,000 was given to deep clean the kitchen, repair windows, and restore the capital reserve fund. This enduring legacy serves as a sterling model for faithful living. May all of us benefit from this example and generosity. Our initial PPP loan (2020) was approved to be converted into a grant and we have been approved for the second PPP loan for 2021.

Individuals are stepping up to assume the operational tasks that were unassigned by recent resignations. Thank vou, all!

Rush Church will be collecting donations in May for the Rush-Henrietta Area Food Terminal (RHAFT). During this time of uncertainty, RHAFT is very busy distributing food to families in the Rush-Henrietta area.

RHAFT gratefully accepts all non-perishable food items, personal hygiene products, and paper goods. However, the following items are especially needed: 100% Juice: bottles, boxes, packs; Jello and Pudding; Instant Mashed Potatoes, Mayo and Condiments; Coffee: instant and ground (no K-cups); Fresh Vegetables; Canned Meat/ Fish Products: Ham, Spam, Tuna, etc; Hamburger/Tuna Helper; Fruits: cans, jars, packs, etc; Toiletries/Bar Soap/ Paper Goods.

Due to the COVID 19 Virus, RHAFT is accepting donations 9AM – 5PM every day. Please bring your donations to the Don Cook Senior Center, 515 Calkins Rd, Henrietta NY 14623. There is a BLUE container in front of the Center. Town employees monitor & pick-up the donations, disinfect all products & transport them to the food cupboard. This is being done to insure the safety for all involved. Thank you. Or, you can bring items to the church Monday – Friday from 7AM – 5PM and leave them in the box in the vestibule. We will see they are taken to the center.



PromíseLand Playground Project Update!

We continue to raise funds for our playground project. The contract has been finalized and equipment ordered! We will be setting up a workday to prep the playground area. This will include redistributing the rubber mulch, removing the old play structure and a general spruce up of the playground space. We anticipate this will be done late May.

Through your generous donations, we continue to reduce the amount of the loan we anticipate taking from the endowment fund. You can still help us! There is no aircon, as they call it, at the orphanage or in the hovels in which the hospice staff works. Siphewe, Noreen, and Happiness walk up and down hills carrying large basins of water to bathe their patients. They are paid less than \$100/month.
