I begin planning for the next visit to South Africa at this time and it brings me great joy. The



relationships we've built with the staff of Zululand Hospice Association (ZHA) and Musa weNkosi as well as our hosts, Eddie, Gavin, and Jenny, are full of memories of good times. The reality of having these wonderful experiences along with the support we are able to provide brings immense satisfaction and blessing.

I have a long list of scriptures and

quotes that have become meaningful as a result of these partnerships. Here are a few:

Matthew 25:31-40 is one. We watch the ZHA staff providing the donations of food from Woolworths. As I witnessed a frail young woman with HIV and TB receive a bucket of fresh vegetables, fruit and meat, I thought it would be worth our support if this were the only thing they provided. But in addition, they monitor the health status, provide medication, emotional



and spiritual support and more. Titus 3:14 "But our people should also learn to devote themselves to doing good in order to meet pressing needs, so they aren't unproductive."

Philippians 2:4 "Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others."

As of Wednesday, December 27, we have received \$269,200.00 or 53.84% in pledges towards our \$500,000.00 goal. Of the amount pledged, we have received \$125,142.54 of which \$22,716.23 has been spent on fabric to reupholster the sanctuary chairs, for the

materials and installation of the carpet and baseboard in the lobby, sitting area and halls and for repairs to gutters. Five thousand (\$5,000.00), not pledged, of this total has been designated for an electronic sign. Pledges continue to be accepted. 
