



Why:	Because everyone loves cookies and with your help we can continue this enjoyable ministry!




Welcome Genesee Area Campus Ministries Board!

Sunday Service Assistants

Our Sunday Service Assistants are very important to our ongoing Sunday ministry. We have openings in several areas waiting to be filled.

Ushers for both the 8:30 and 10:45 services. Two people are needed for each service, serving on a rotating basis. The frequency is dependent upon the number of volunteers. Please speak to Louise Miller for the 8:30 service and Barb Kingsley for the 10:45 service.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Arriving at least 15 minutes before the service
- Lighting the candles on the altar and chancel area
- Wearing a nametag; they are found in the office on the wall next to the door
- Standing at the door to the sanctuary and handing out bulletins
- Assisting with seating whenever appropriate
- Being open and available to answer questions for new families/individuals

• Being aware of and knowing where the nursery and quiet rooms are for families with young children; bulletins and busy bags are also available for young children.

- Taking up the collection, the last Sunday (usually the 4th Sunday) an additional collection for Musa weNkosi Orphanage is taken in baskets
- Counting the number of attendees in the service, annotate number on small slip found near the collection plates, and either hand in with the collection plates or place on Barb Kingsley's desk

Communion Assistants help to serve communion to the congregation at both services. We are especially in need of people to assist during the 8:30 service. If you would like to serve or have questions, please see Barb Kingsley.

Communion Bread Providers to either bake bread or provide store bought bread, both regular and gluten free, are needed for each Sunday. This is a new Sunday morning ministry. If you would like to make bread, copies of “Pastor Cathy’s Communion Bread” are available or you can use your own recipe. If this ministry is of interest to you, please see Erin Bills.





RHAFT Thank You

January 4, 2020

Dear Rush United Methodist Church,

Thanks so very much for your check of \$225.00 representing donations from the members of Rush United Methodist Church to RHAFT, Rush-Henrietta Area Food Terminal. We understand the donation represents cash donations from your congregation from May through December.

Last year, RHSFT Volunteers provided food on 350 occasions to 201 families who faced an emergency shortage of food. Most families received help one or two times during the year; other families in difficult situations received help 3 to 5 times.

Forty-two families were helped in December by RHAFT and other community partners through the "Adopt-a-Family" project. Both RHAFT and Rush-Henrietta Rotary volunteers visited the homes of 298 senior citizens as part of the Senior Citizen Outreach Program, providing Holiday greeting and gifts to 327 seniors.

Thanks again for the generous donation from the members of Rush United Methodist Church and for being partners in providing food to families in need.


