


Back-to-School Super Sale

Capital Stewardship Campaign Update

As of Wednesday, June 25, 2025, we have received \$269,200.00 or 53.84% in pledges towards our \$500,000.00 goal. Of the amount pledged, we have received \$199,328.49 of which \$134,558.69 has been spent on fabric to reupholster the sanctuary chairs, for the materials and installation of the carpet and baseboard in the lobby, sitting area and halls, for repairs to gutters, as a deposit and finishing the drainage work in the parking lot and west side of the building and patching, sealing and striping the driveway and parking lot and for the permit and deposit on the electronic sign and electrical work to

install the sign. Twenty-one thousand two hundred seventy dollars (\$21,270.00), not pledged, of this total has been designated for the electronic sign. \$10,000.00 of this was donated by PromiseLand Childcare. Pledges continue to be accepted. Even if you haven't made a pledge, donations to the Capital Stewardship Campaign are gratefully accepted.

South Africa Visit, 2025

Last month I asked you to pray that we would remain healthy and safe, be blessed and be a blessing to everyone we encountered.

Prayers answered! To hear how we were blessed, ask the travelers.

I had a cold and cough I was sure I could kick before leaving, but the day before I was still coughing. I went to the doctor and was told not to travel. I received a prescription for an antibiotic, but did not heed her advice. I recovered despite all those hours in planes and airports. Prayers answered!



We were blessed by Pastor Kyle's being on the team in many ways and I benefitted by not having to drive. It was a huge relief for me. Yesterday's Zululand Observer reported an accident with a fatality on the 102, a road we took a number of times. There are "abnormal loads," coal tippers, sugarcane and eucalyptus trucks and lawlessness. We are home safe. Prayers answered!

Manager Christine wrote, "When

you and your travel friends came this year, we were in a slightly better financial position than the previous year but still battling to make ends meet every month as the need for palliative patient care is increasing...Wow, a donation of R448,291.58 came into our bank! We praise God for your dedication and continued hard work for hospice." As we said good-by at the airport Christine said, "Because of you, we have no worries through the end of the year." I was overwhelmed. Seeing the need, witnessing the work of the staff and being able to contribute in significant ways is a HUGE blessing. Prayers answered!

There are two other areas for which I asked prayer in the past months. Jane Ashburner is the only staff member who has been with ZHA in the 22 years of our partnership. Her husband, Geoff was diagnosed with melanoma. His recent PET scan was clear. Prayers answered!

Hospice advertised for a nurse as Jane has dropped back to 3 days a week. I asked for prayer as they decided

between applicants. Professional nurse Siza was hired. She is retired from a government position and has much knowledge and many connections so is able to access help for various situations. She is Zulu so does not require translation from the careworkers. The team was impressed with her caring and skill. Prayers answered!

Prayers answered, but please don't stop praying for the staff. Jane is doing 5 days work in 3 days, but

she said, "I have become so clever," due to Dawn's helping her be more efficient on the computer.

Another issue of concern is the careworkers feeling undervalued. We share their feelings. We were told last year they are addressed as nurses because they fill that

role in many ways. My best guess is that they make \$2.50-3.00/hour. The minimum wage in the country is \$1.60/ hr. so staff and management may feel they are well compensated, but please join us in praying for a significant raise for them.

I am so grateful for Rush UMC's support of this partnership. Having Pastor Kyle's and the team's participation is far beyond anything I ever dreamed or hoped for. "Brothers and sisters, we must always thank God for you. This is only right because your faithfulness is growing by leaps and bounds. And the love that all of you have for each other is increasing." 2 Thessalonians 1:3.

Mission Trip to Hardwick, VT

We are planning on supporting a team of Skilled, Semi-Skilled and those wishing to become Skilled to work on Home Rebuilding Projects. This session will run 1 week of work with daily travel or overnight available all days. We welcome other Church Congregations as well as Individuals interested in joining our team.

We will not know the type of project until closer to our departure. Most likely our assignment will be in a reconstruction project or following another team in a quest of putting a home(s) back together.

The team is made up of General Contractors, Very Skilled Home owners and those who have never raised a hammer before. Every person will be paired up with someone who knows about the assigned task. No one will be asked to do anything they do not want to do nor is unsafe.

The work week is August 3rd to the 9th, 2025

There will be a meeting at Immanuel UMC on July 15th at 7PM (for those at a distance, a Zoom link will be provided). For information or questions please call or email Mike Block.

It is important to submit all required forms by the posted date. Any questions regarding this trip please contact the persons named below. Submit forms before July 15th, 2025.

Helpful requirements for a successful trip not only depend on the physical on site workers but the support team to send them there. It costs about \$300 per person for the week to accomplish this type of trip; this is only an average and not a requirement.

Those **individuals joining our team who are** not members of Immanuel UMC are asked to **Donate** to support the trip expenses. This **Donation** will help cover the cost of Food, additional Insurance and Fuel if you are riding with the group. There is a **\$16/night Donation** requested for the overnight (to support the local cost of the church you would be staying at), **\$74/per person Donation** to support the material used for the rebuild effort and **\$25/day to cover meals**. The required insurance is roughly \$11/week per person.
