


A Note from Pastor Todd "A Way Forward"

As the United Methodist Church is dividing over the issue of inclusion and sexuality, the future of individual congregations will be decided by voting members of local churches. The faithful will discern God's will and direction through prayer, devotions, listening and learning, all the while avoiding conflict resulting from attempts to change the minds of those with deeply seated beliefs and values. Faithful Christians can respectfully disagree while living in peace.

"We have been very blessed this week to have Erma, Gail and Dodie with us. It is so encouraging when people visit.

Dodie has been teaching the sewing people to sew pajamas for the children at the home. It meant so much to them that someone would come so far to help them."

I have 18 children in need of a sponsor. I have a picture and profile for each one. We ask for regular prayers for your child and \$30/month as you are able. Barb wires the money in April and early December.

The postal system is broken so we can send messages by email and Elaine will print your letter for the child. This is valuable because learning English is important.

I am ever so grateful for your participation which provides the on-going prayer and monetary support For Zululand Hospice and Musa weNkosi.




Board of Trustees

Parsonage Sale Finalized

The Board of Trustees is happy to announce that the sale of the church parsonage has been completed. Final closing documents were signed on Wednesday, July 6. The trustees were charged with this task by the church congregation, at the November 20, 2021, special church conference. Several possible realtors were considered, and after some discussion the trustees selected Lisa Shingleton, a Rush Church member and realtor with



Keller Williams. Lisa recommended some basic updates for the parsonage, and a wonderful group of volunteers worked hard to complete those tasks. Thank you to: Dick and Cindy Wallace, Alethea Coulter and Geoff Furman, Leon Perkins, Britta Stambaugh, Chris Chamot,

and George and Cindy Gray.

The parsonage was put on the market on April 3 for \$204,900.00, and after several days of showings the church received 5 offers. The Board of Trustees reviewed the offers and accepted an offer for \$235,000.00. It took some time to reach the point of closing, due to the complicated legalities of selling a church property, but we are happy to have accomplished the task. After commissions and legal fees, the church received \$215,336.17 from the proceeds of the sale. The money is now the responsibility of the Endowment Fund, with the interest to be used for the pastor's living allowance. Thank you to everyone who participated in this process, and a big thanks to our realtor Lisa Shingleton for all her time and support!

Who Is Your Neighbor?

We are familiar with the second instruction in the greatest commandment, "Love your neighbor as yourself." The story of the Good Samaritan ends with Jesus asking,



"Which one of these three was a neighbor to the man who encountered thieves?" The legal expert answered, "The one who demonstrated mercy toward him." Luke 10:37

The early church demonstrated mercy. "All the believers were united and shared everything. They would sell pieces of property and possessions and distribute the proceeds to everyone who needed them. Acts 3:44 "There were no needy persons among them." Acts 4:34

Who are OUR neighbors to whom we can demonstrate mercy?

Our neighbor is the person in need of a visit or phone call now that they are no longer able to attend church, the family in need of clothing or kitchenware from the Super Sale room, the refugee in need of housing, the Sudanese in need of clean water, the orphan in need of the care provided by Musa weNkosi, the person in need of "a meal and more." Maybe you will be a neighbor making it possible to reopen the Coffee Shop at Pieter's Family Life, a part of Heritage Christian Services. Pre-pandemic, the coffee shop was a sacred place for fellowship,

devotions, meeting old friends and making new ones. It served families, staff, and the general public.

"Jesus teaches the lawyer in the story's front matter that loving God with heart, mind, soul, and strength 'is all good' but only the midterm exam. Going out into the world beyond the safety of one's tribe and into the heart of another of a different cultural or religious stripe - that is the final exam."


